

Summer School Security Checklist

The end of the school year and summer break gives school administrators the opportunity to conduct a school safety check on the physical systems in and around the facility. Here's a safety checklist to get you started on some basic things you can do while school is out in order to strengthen security at your facility.

Check all exterior locks to determine proper function and make repairs as needed
Check all interior locking doors to determine function and make repairs as needed
Clean, aim, and focus video surveillance cameras
Verify all cameras, card readers, and alarm sensors are operational
Verify all cardholders in the access control server are active
Verify that the video surveillance recorder is retaining the intended amount of stored video such as 30, 60, or 90 days
Test and inspect door intercom and other communication systems
Review outside landscaping and remove or trim overgrown foliage that blocks field of view for cameras or security personnel
Check all lighting and repair all nonfunctional interior & exterior lighting to improve the field of view
Determine if training is needed for new faculty & substitute staff to ensure compliance with security protocol
Update software to the latest version on all security devices by checking the manufacturer's web site
Verify video surveillance and access control server software is current and up-to-date
Test & verify lockdown system & procedures
Change batteries in all wireless security devices
Change batteries in all wireless fire detection devices
Test and inspect all fire detection and extinguishing devices
Update firmware to the latest version on all fire and intrusion alarm panels
Verify that time & date are accurate on all systems and adjust open/closed schedules as necessary
